A. Hiring

- The Town has received three extremely qualified candidates. Two are submitting resumes, and the department is currently working on the background of one candidate.

B. Employee recognitions

- Officer Dollar recently closed a felony domestic violence case. Officer Dollar thoroughly investigated the case, and was able to obtain a full confession from the suspect.
- The Dayton Police Department would like to recognize Susan Smith for her efforts to obtain the System for Award Management (SAM) number activation, which is required for federal grant funding.
- The Dayton Police Department would also like to recognize the Town of Dayton's public works department for assisting with a bicycle crash that occurred on Mason Street. The maintenance department came across the crash and directed traffic until the officer was able to render aid, complete his investigation, and was able to take over directing traffic.
- The Dayton Police Department had two officers receive Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) certification. CIT is a forty-hour course to aid officers in handling and caring for citizens with mental health issues.



3. Project Updates

- The Dayton Police Department is still working on the Mobile Data Terminal (MDT) purchase. Ms. Hines from the USDA has been working to get the Dayton Police Department approved for grant funding to cover 55% of the cost.
 - Staff is using the Stealth Stat System to obtain data for the speed signs required by VDOT. There have been some technical difficulties with the Stealth Stat unit that the department is working through that has caused a minor delay. Data should be completed and ready for submission to VDOT shortly.
 - Staff is researching the purchase of optics. Optics reduce the opportunity for civil liability in the event of a shooting. Optic technology allows for faster and easier sight alignment. This technology will improve the department's overall ability to provide safety and security to the town residents of Dayton, while reducing civil liability.
 - On April 27, 2019, volunteers from the Town of Dayton participated at a nuisance property to comply with nuisance ordinances.
